



DON'T GET HIGH & DRIVE



Whether you've used marijuana, alcohol or other drugs, impaired driving is illegal – and dangerous to you and others.



CANNABIS & DRIVING

Cannabis has an impact on parts of the brain that are responsible for your body's ability to move, balance, coordinate, remember, and make sound judgments. Cannabis use before or while driving a motor vehicle can:

- Slow your reaction time and ability to make decisions
- Impair your coordination behind the wheel
- Distort your perception on the road

KNOW THE LAWS

In CT, if you operate a vehicle while under the influence of cannabis, or other drugs or alcohol, it's a DUI, which is a crime.



PREVENT DUIs

If you need to drive a motor vehicle, be safe and do not use cannabis before or during your drive. Make the choice not to drive high and remind your loved ones to do the same.

- Assign a designated driver who is not under the influence of cannabis, or any other drug or alcohol.
- Get a ride from someone who has not been using, or call a rideshare service or a taxi.
